**SUBJECT: URS ENERGY & CONSTRUCTION, INC., CONSENT TO TRANSFER NRC  
LICENSE, MAIL CONTROL NO. 584909**

Dear Mr. Hollaway:

By letters dated September 19, 2014 (ML14265A424), and October 16, 2014 (ML14300A217), URS Energy & Construction, Inc. (URS E&C), the holder of NRC materials license number 12-31469-01, submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) a request for approval of an indirect transfer of control. URS E&C provided information required by 10 CFR 30.34(b) pertaining to the transfer of control. URS has entered into a merger agreement with AECOM Technology Corporation (AECOM) in which URS will ultimately merge with and into ACM Mountain II, LLC, a direct wholly-owned subsidiary of AECOM. URS will survive the merger as a direct wholly-owned subsidiary of AECOM.

In its September 19, 2014, letter, URS E&C stated that there will be no change with respect to the license or licensed activities, including personnel having control over licensed activities and the use, possession, location, and storage of licensed materials. Based on the above understandings, and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report, which documents the NRC staff's safety and security review of the request, the NRC consents to the proposed indirect transfer.

Please note that you will need to notify the NRC promptly, in writing, after the transaction has been finalized and include signed documentation of the completion of the action. Please notify the NRC, in writing, if this planned transaction has not been consummated within 30 days of the date of this letter or this consent may be deemed null and void. Future changes in the licensee's name, licensed use, licensed materials, licensed location, or persons responsible for licensed material would require submission of a request to amend the license. NRC approval must be received prior to implementation of the proposed change.
