## General Comment

I wish we could see more debate in public about the wisdom of siting two more reactors at a site that will be ground zero for sea level rise and extreme weather and that is upwind of a vast, densely-populated urban area. The ongoing disaster at Fukushima, Japan is precisely the sort of thing that might happen at Turkey Point. None of the experts can actually say for certain how high the dikes need to be in every possible event. I find it even more troubling that the same utility company that is hoping to expand the size and extend the life of this aging nuclear power plant, FPL is behind lobbying efforts to keep domestic rooftop solar power from competing in Florida. We should examine this entire picture and think carefully about the consequences.
