Hi Moira,

Hope that Spring has arrived at West Valley by now or is just around the corner...
Its warming up here and you can hear the leaves on the trees growing now...

I have two questions based on last week's Weekly Project Report:

Under the Topic of Safety- the Weekly Project Report states:

"A meeting was held with the Cattaraugus County Emergency Coordinator in Little Valley, New York, to discuss Emergency Operations Center (EOC) interfaces, hazardous material response, and complete the WVDP off-site response self-assessment."

The NRC recently became aware of a DOE report published in December 2014(http://energy.gov/sites/prod/files/2014/12/f19/2014_WVDP_Emergency_Mgmt_Tech_Basis_and_Emerg_Preparedness-December%202014.pdf) that assessed the DOE-WVDP's progress on implementing the Fukushima Lessons Learned into its Emergency Management Program. Through the DOE Office of Enterprise Assessments (EA), a review was performed in part to determine WVDP's progress in implementing enhancements recommended in DOE policy that stemmed from the DOE's evaluation of Fukushima Lessons Learned for its facilities (OE-1, "Improving DOE Capabilities for Mitigating Beyond Design Basis Events (BDBEs).") The DOE EA found that among other things, the method DOE-WVDP used to quantify the material at risk (MAR) in one of its storage areas was not adequate; and the WVDP plans and procedures may not support appropriate and conservative event categorization and classification, protective actions, and offsite notification. DOE also made several recommendations

Question 1: Has DOE addressed the finding and recommendations that DOE EA provided in the December 2014 Report? What is the status?


Question 2: Due to the nature of some of the material that must be stored, handled, and transported during decommissioning, based on the DOE December 2014 report, does DOE-WVDP believe that area of Emergency Response may need to be enhanced? If so, has this been communicated to appropriate organizations?
