SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 03036177/2015002, INTEGRITY TESTLABS, LLC, NEW CASTLE, DELAWARE SITE, TEMPORARY JOBSITE AT DELAWARE CITY REFINERY, DELAWARE CITY, DELAWARE, AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Spike:

On March 18, 2015, and continuing in-office until April 27, 2015, Scott Wilson of this office conducted an inspection at the above address and at a temporary jobsite located at the Delaware City Refinery in Delaware City, Delaware. Mr. Wilson was accompanied by Ms. Lizette Roldan, an NRC Health Physicist from Region IV, as an observer. The inspection was an examination of your licensed activities as they relate to security and to compliance with the Commission's regulations and the license conditions. The inspection consisted of observations by the inspector, interviews with personnel, and a selective examination of representative records. The findings of the inspection were discussed with you and William (Bill) Batting of your organization via telephone at the conclusion of the inspection on April 27, 2015.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC determined that two Severity Level IV violations of NRC requirements occurred. Because of the security-related nature of the violations, a description of the violations and your corrective actions are included in non-public enclosures to this letter. The violations were evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The violations are cited in the Notice of Violation (Notice), provided as Enclosure 1 to this letter. The violations are cited because the violations were identified by NRC. Enclosure 2 provides a determination of severity level and a description of the corrective actions taken by Integrity Testlabs, LLC, to address any violations.
