SUBJECT: TERMINATION OF FACILITY CODE 1057 FOR FLUOR ENTERPRISES, INC.  
TECHNICAL ASSIGNMENT CONTROL NUMBER L34298

Dear Mr. Toelle:

This refers to letter number ACO 14-0036, dated November 12, 2014, requesting that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) terminate Facility Code (FC) 1057, previously designated for the Fluor Enterprises, Inc., Greenville, South Carolina facility (Fluor).

In your letter, you stated that throughout USEC Inc.'s (USEC's - now Centrus Energy Corp.) restructuring process that began on March 5, 2014, an effort of downsizing occurred and Fluor contracts have been terminated, which the NRC staff has already confirmed. In addition, in your letter you stated that on October 26, 2009, staff from the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and the NRC performed a close-out survey of Fluor's classified holdings for the purpose of terminating Fluor's NRC-approved facility clearance for the possession of classified material at the SECRET-Restricted Data (SRD) level. However, following the close-out survey, by letter dated November 6, 2009 (AET 09-0083), USEC requested that the NRC instead change Fluor's facility clearance to a non-possessing status of classified material so that Fluor could maintain cleared individuals to continue to work for the American Centrifuge Plant (ACP) in Piketon, Ohio. In its letter, USEC also requested the cancellation of three Fluor cyber security plans previously approved by the NRC. In response, the NRC issued an updated Facility Data Approval Record (FDAR) for Fluor, changing to non-possessing status at the SRD level, and approved the request to cancel Fluor's security program and the three previously approved cyber security plans. Removal and return to DOE of the classified security equipment that supported the three cyber security plans were verified during the close-out survey.

The NRC staff, in coordination with staff from DOE's Nuclear Energy Oak Ridge Site Office has completed its review of your November 12, 2014, submittal. Based on the NRC staff's review of your submittal, the NRC staff's confirmation of termination of Fluor's contracts for support of the ACP, and the NRC's cancellation of Fluor's security program and cyber security plans, the NRC is transferring Cognizant Security Agency (CSA) responsibilities for Fluor and FC 1057 to DOE's Richland, WA, Operations Office. These actions will be reflected in a revised FDAR to be issued by DOE. The NRC will no longer have regulatory oversight of regulated activities at Fluor.

This action closes efforts under Technical Assignment Control number L34298.
