SUBJECT: NOTICE OF EXPIRED LICENSE

Dear Dr. Raza:

On May 31, 2015, your NRC license expired. As of the date of this letter, we have not received a request from you to continue your authorization to possess and use material or a request to retire your NRC license. Your possession and/or use of NRC-licensed material without a valid license is a violation of NRC regulations. If you possess licensed material without a valid license, the NRC may take escalated enforcement action against you and may impose a civil penalty.

On December 18, 2014, Lester Tripp of this office performed an inspection of your facility. At the time, your representative, Abid Raza, stated that all licensed radioactive material in your possession was disposed of by transfer to Digirad. On December 22, 2015, Mr. Tripp sent you an NRC Form 314, (Certificate of Disposition of Material) to document that you no longer require an NRC license and that any sealed sources possessed pursuant to your license were transferred to an entity permitted to receive such material. On March 30, 2015, Mr. Tripp spoke to Abid Raza to inquire if the Form NRC 314 was completed and submitted to the NRC. Abid Raza stated that the NRC Form 314 had been submitted. Mr. Raza agreed to resend the Form but it still hasn't been received.

Accordingly, you must take the following actions: (1) immediately dispose of, or transfer to an entity authorized to receive the material in question, all radioactive material formerly authorized by the expired license; and (2) complete the enclosed Form NRC-314. The disposal or transfer must comply with the requirements of 10 CFR 20.2001 or 10 CFR 30.41, respectively, and with the requirements, if any, of your NRC license. On Form NRC-314, describe the byproduct material that was involved, as well as when and where (or by whom) the material was disposed or transferred. Return the completed form within 10 days of the date of this letter so that we can retire your expired license.

Failure to notify the NRC of the termination of licensed activity is a violation of 10 CFR 30.36. Failure to respond to this letter within 10 days may result in the NRC taking escalated enforcement action against you, which may include a civil penalty.
