Commissioner Baran's Comments on SECY-15-0046, "Request for Approval of Staff Recommendation to Authorize Indian Point Nuclear Generating; James A. Fitzpatrick Nuclear Power Plant; Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station; and R.E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant to Use Section 161A Preemption Authority"

Entergy Nuclear Operations and Exelon Generation Company have requested to use the preemption authority granted to the Commission under Section 161A of the Atomic Energy Act at Indian Point, Fitzpatrick, Nine Mile Point, and Ginna. The NRC staff found that the firearms, weapons, and devices identified by the licensees are currently in use at the four sites, are necessary for the protection of the facilities and associated special nuclear materials, and are subject to state law that would restrict the possession and use of such firearms, weapons, and devices at the plants. The staff has determined that the requests for preemption authority meet the requirements of the designation order, Section 161A, and applicable NRC regulations and recommends that the Commission approve the requests.

Accordingly, I authorize the use of Section 161A preemption authority by Entergy at Indian Point and Fitzpatrick and by Exelon at Nine Mile Point and Ginna. I authorize the Director of the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation to complete the required license amendment actions and to issue the draft final confirmatory orders included in SECY-15-0046, subject to the attached edit being made to each of the orders. I approve issuance of the notification letter to the Governor of New York, subject to the attached edits, and staff coordination with SECY to support the issuance of the letter concurrent with the issuance of the final confirmatory orders and associated *Federal Register* notice.

¹ The designation order issued by the staff on June 5, 2013, designated a limited class of facilities as eligible to apply for Commission authorization to use the authority of Section 161A. The reactors at Indian Point, Fitzpatrick, Nine Mile Point, and Ginna are all covered by the designation order.

Dear Governor Cuomo:

On behalf of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), I am <u>writing to informing</u> you <u>thatof an action</u> the Commission is <u>taking to granting</u> a limited class of NRC-licensed facilities in the State of New York permission to use the preemption authority granted to the Commission under Section 161A of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (AEA), as amended (42 United States Code § 2201a). This authority permits the licensee to transfer, receive, possess, transport, import, and use certain weapons, ammunition and other devices notwithstanding local, State, <u>local</u>, and certain Federal firearms laws (<u>including regulations</u>) that would otherwise prohibit such actions.

The NRC is taking this action to ensure the continued implementation of effective physical security strategies maintenance of the necessary security posture at designated NRC-licensed facilities in advance of a final rulemaking on this matter. A letter dated May 31, 2013, informed you of the Commission's intent to implement its authority under Section 161A of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, through the issuance of Orders in advance of a final rulemaking on this matter. Subsequently, on June 5, 2013, the Commission issued an order (Enforcement Action 13-092) entitled, "Order Designating an Interim Class of NRC-Licensed Facilities that are Eligible to Apply to the Commission for Authorization to use the Authority Granted Under the Provisions of Section 161A of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as Amended." A copy of this order is available in the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) under Accession No. ML13121A459.

The order designatinged Indian Point Nuclear Generating, James A. FitzPatrick Nuclear Power Plant, Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station, and R. E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant, as eligible to apply to the Commission for authorization to use Section 161A preemption authority. In response to the order, the licensees of the above designated facilities submitted to the Commission a request that the NRC grant the authority to use Section 161A at these designated facilities. The Commission has reviewed these requests and is approving the use of Section 161A preemption authority at these facilities.

The NRC's granting of this authority will be documented in a confirmatory order issued separately to each of the above facilities by the appropriate NRC licensing office. These confirmatory orders will be issued in accordance with established NRC processes.
