Dear Mr. Zimmer:

On June 25, 2015, two inspectors from the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) conducted a routine inspection at your facility in Maryland Heights, Missouri, with continued in-office review through August 3, 2015. The purpose of the inspection was to review activities performed under your NRC license to ensure that activities were being performed in accordance with NRC requirements. Our in-office review included a review of security-related information not available during the inspection. Ms. Deborah Piskura of my staff conducted a final exit meeting with you by telephone on August 3, 2015 to discuss the inspection findings.

During this inspection, the NRC staff examined activities conducted under your license related to public health and safety. Additionally, the staff examined your compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations as well as the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selected examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities, and interviews with personnel.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined that Severity Level IV violations of NRC requirements occurred. The violations were evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The violations are of a security-related nature. Details of the violations are available in the enclosed non-public Security Addendum (Enclosure 2). The violations are cited in the enclosed, non-public Notice of Violation (Notice) (Enclosure 1). The NRC is citing the violations in the enclosed Notice because the inspectors identified the violations.

Enclosures 1 and 2 contain Sensitive
Unclassified Non-Safeguards Information.
When separated from the Enclosures, this
transmittal letter is decontrolled.

In accordance with Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter will be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC's Public Document Room or from the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>. However, because the violations involve security-related information, the enclosures to this letter and your response, if you choose to provide one, will not be made available electronically for public inspection. If you do respond, please mark the top of each page with "Security-Related Information – Withhold Under 10 CFR 2.390". To the extent possible, your response should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information so that it can be made publicly available without redaction.
