Dear Congressman Derrick:

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This letter is in response to your January 22, 1982 request for NRC commen on Mr. Plotnik's January 10, 1982 inquiry concerning the Duke Power Company intention to reduce low-level radioactive wastes.

By letter dated December 14, 1981, Duke Power Company informed the NRC that it is their intention to file a request for approval to incinerate low-level radioactive waste at the Oconee Nuclear Station. To date, we have not received this filing. It is our understanding that a new facility is being designed for the Oconee Nuclear Station which will process low-level radioactive waste materials, both solid and liquid, through equipment commonly used for this purpose and also by use of a Fluid Bed Incinerator designed by Aerojet Energy Conversion Company. Since present NRC Regulations (10 CFR 20.305) prohibit the disposal of any licensed material by incineration except as specifically approved by the Commission, prior approval by the NRC is required before operation of the proposed facility may proceed.

Mr. Plotnik questions whether processes involving evaporation and incineration can be done without increasing the radiation released from the facility. The Oconee Nuclear Station continues to operate well within the NRC established radioactive effluent release limits while employing evaporation processes for volume reduction of low-level liquid radioactive wastes. In addition, Duke Power Company has committed to keep radioactive effluent releases as low as reasonably achievable.

Upon receipt of a request from Duke Power Company to allow incineration of low-level radioactive wastes at the Oconee Nuclear Station. the NRC will publish a "Notice of Proposed Issuance" in the Federal Register which will allow a 30 day public comment period on the proposed operation of this facility. The NRC will also, concurrent with receiving public comments. review the proposed design to ensure that the applicable Regulations and Regulatory Guides have been satisfied. We will also independently verify that the operation of the proposed facility will maintain radioactive effluents to levels as low as reasonably achievable. The results of our review will determine what restrictions in the Technical Specifications, in The Honorable Butler Derrick

addition to those already applicable, will be required for the NRC to allow operation of the facility.

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We trust that this information is responsive to your request.
