What drew us together on Facebook, is our mutual love and concern for our great water resource in our state, the Ogallala Aquifer, and indeed water everywhere. I am copying her note below, that she has already sent to you, because she has followed the Crow Butte Uranium Mine issue much closer than I, she talks about it often on FB, and she is involved with and friends with the Native Americans who also are working on this because it directly impacts their drinking water. Cindy herself lives with pure unfiltered Aquifer water bubbling up through her farm; she knows she is unique and blessed in having such an unspoiled resource right at her door to appreciate every day. She tries hard to get others to appreciate this gift and to understand how important it is to protect it. She says it best, so I include her note here:

• I've been an RN for 35 years and have seen many cancer patients suffer greatly. The best cure for cancer is prevention. I'm particularly concerned about environmental toxins, including contaminants in our drinking water. I attended two days of the hearing in Crawford. I am appalled at what I heard at the hearing and what I've read. I do not believe the health and welfare of people has been taken into consideration. I request the Crow Butte Uranium Mine be closed and a long-term health study of area residents be completed.
