
By letter dated June 22, 2015, Prime Healthcare Services – Port Huron, LLC (Prime), on behalf of Trinity Health-Michigan (Trinity), submitted to the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) a Request for Consent to Indirect License Transfer of NRC Materials License No. 21-15638-01. Based on the information provided, we understand that as a result of a purchase agreement between Prime and Trinity, control of St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron will be indirectly transferred to Prime. We further understand that this transfer will not result in any change to the licensed material, persons using the licensed material, locations of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report which documents the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the transfer. It is our understanding that the effective date of the transfer will be on September 1, 2015. **Please note that you will need to notify us within 30 days, in writing, after the transaction has been finalized and include a signed copy of the purchase agreement confirming completion of the transaction.** Also, please include information to support other necessary changes such as a facility name change. With this information, we can issue an amendment to the aforementioned NRC license to reflect the transaction, if necessary.
