This last week, it was announced that Duke Power Company of Charlotte, North Carolina, experienced a problem with one of their nuclear power plants. The news reports of this event noted that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) had issued "numerousness warnings" to Duke Power. As a share holder in Duke Power, I am interested in the extent of these warnings and how they compare, in both quantity and severity to other nuclear power plant operations.

I am requesting the assistance of your office in collecting the following information regrading Duke Power of Charlotte, North Carolina:

- o How many warnings, issues, or findings has the NRC sighted Duke Power for in the last 18 months?
- o How many of the above warnings, issues, or findings remain unresolved past the corrective action date established by the NRC?

o How does the number of warnings, issues, and/or findings compare with other nuclear power plant operations during the same period?
