The Office of Classification has reviewed the URENCO U.S.A. (UUSA) document *Security Plan for the IAEA Inspection Visits to Sensitive Areas* (Document # LES-15-00144-NRC) which was submitted by UUSA to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission on August 24, 2015.

The document noted above presents a plan to adequately protect equipment or machinery that would reveal classified information through visual access. The Office of Classification has no objection to UUSA implementing this updated plan during International Atomic Energy Agency visits.

In addition, because no changes were made to the Enrichment Technology U.S., Inc., Work Instruction for International Atomic Energy visits (Document # ETUS-WI-587, Issue 2 dated 1/17/2014), the security plan detailed in ETUS-WI-587, Issue 2 will remain in force.
