The office of the Northern Arapaho Tribal Historic Preservation Office has reviewed the tribal report for the Reno Creek Project.

Let it be known for record the Northern Arapaho Tribe is against this Project for the purpose that Known health effects and environmental effects are very clear. We are not in concurrence with the project. However for Section 106 reasons the Office of the Northern Arapaho Tribal Historic Preservation office has read the Conclusion and Recommendations for the tribal report.

We find that with sites 1 and 2 being out of the APE should have **NO ADVERSE EFFECTS**, which our office is in concurrence of. The sites #, 4 and IA-as sites are located with the Reno Creek APE and will be **ADVERSLEY AFFECTED**.

Within the Summary and Recommendations for this report is there no recommendations of mitigation of sites 3, 4 and 1A-12 identified. They may not be eligible however the best effort in good faith should be taken to take into account the significance these sites are to the tribes. I am not comfortable saying for fact that all 22 isolates are 1A-12 are isolates. However in the beginning of the report Site 4 my tribe had expressed **AVOIDANCE** of this site. Again I would like to state that the recommendations page has no mitigation of Site 4. Although Reno Creek is stating that it doesn't not fall under any historic properties which my tribe defines a historic property as any artifact of "Historical" criteria, my tribe does define "Traditional Cultural Properties" as anything of traditional cultural significance.
