1. What are the known technical or regulatory issues with the current version of the Regulatory Guide (RG)?

This RG was originally published in March 1978. It was first revised in December 1985 (Revision 1) and again in 2010 (Revision 2) and there are no technical or regulatory issues with the current version of this RG.

It should be noted that one of the references cited in the guide, ANSI/HPS N13.1, "Sampling and Monitoring Releases of Airborne Radioactive Substances from the Stacks and Ducts of Nuclear Facilities," was superseded in 2011. However, the update does not affect the technical content of the RG. Also, the reference to ANSI/ASQ E4-2004, "Quality Systems for Environmental Data and Technology Programs," for quality assurance and quality control guidance is still current.

2. What is the impact on internal and external stakeholders of <u>not</u> updating the RG for the known issues, in terms of anticipated numbers of licensing and inspection activities over the next several years?

There is no impact since there are no known technical or regulatory issues.

3. What is an estimate of the level of effort needed to address identified issues in terms of full-time equivalent (FTE) and contractor resources?

Not applicable. Since there are no technical or regulatory issues with the current version of the RG, the level of effort is 0 FTE and 0 contract dollars.
