Enclosed is Amendment No. 77 renewing your NRC Material License No. 21-00182-03 in accordance with your request. Note that we have renumbered some items.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

We have noted that your June 15, 2015, application contained updated Decommissioning Financial Assurance (DFA) certification documentation – including amendments to your letter of credit and standby trust agreement, dated May 6 and 19, 2015, respectively. The submitted DFA is in review under a separate action, Mail Control No. 586970. Under that action, we may follow up with you to request additional information at a later date. To follow up on the status of our review of your DFA, please contact Materials Licensing Branch Reviewer Jennifer L. Bishop at (630) 829-9607.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.


