Dear Mr. Thornton:

Enclosed is our response to your October 14, 2015 letter. By letter dated October 14, 2015, your company submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) a Request for Consent to an indirect License Transfer of NRC Materials License No. 12-16941-01. Based on the information provided, we understand that – as a result of a planned acquisition of your parent company's – Olympus Growth Fund IV, L.P.'s assets by Intertek Group plc – control of Professional Service Industries, Inc. will be indirectly transferred to Intertek Group plc. We further understand that the transaction will result in no changes to the licensed materials, persons using the licensed material, location of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program.

Based on the understanding outlined above, and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC Safety Evaluation Report (SER), we have no objection to the described transfer. The SER documents the NRC staff's review of the request.

Please note that you will need to notify us promptly, in writing, after the transaction has been finalized and include a signed copy of the purchase agreement confirming completion of the transaction. With this information, we can issue an administrative amendment to your NRC license to reflect the transaction, if necessary. In addition, if this purchase agreement has not been consummated within 30 days of the date of this letter, please notify us in writing.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.


