We are in receipt of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) invitation for Section 106 consultation regarding the U.S. Army's request for amendment of Materials License #SUC-1593 to include additional sites that possess depleted uranium from the Davy Crockett Weapon System. According to your letter, the military installation, Fort Sill, has been identified as a participant in the proposed license amendment to Source Materials License #SUC-1593.

As the proposed amendment involves two federal agencies, the NRC and the U.S. Army, and as Fort Sill's Environmental Quality Division is the entity that consults our office for all undertakings on the installation, we suggest that you contact Mr. Glen Wheat at Fort Sill regarding questions about historic properties that may be located within the project area and for the identification of Tribal Nations to be consulted regarding the project. Mr. Wheat's office maintains excellent records about the archeological and historic resources under their jurisdiction. We will provide our comments to whichever agency is determined the lead federal agency pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800.
