Dear Ms. Henderson:

Enclosed are the final regulations 32 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 326, 330, 332 and 340. The Illinois Register version is attached as well as the notice to our licensees (below). The final regulations were effective 11/24/15 and correspond to equivalent provisions in the NRC regulations as noted in RATS ID # 2011-1.

There were no substantive changes from the initial proposal. We believe that adoption of these revisions satisfies the compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of Federal and State Materials and Environmental Programs (FSME) Procedure SA-200.

Amendments – 32 Illinois Administrative Code 326, 330, 332 and 340

Final amendments to 32 Ill. Adm. Code 326, 330, 332 and 340 were published on December 11, 2015 in Volume 39, Issue 50, Pages 15,697 - 15,737 of the Illinois Register (http://www.cyberdriveillinois.com/departments/index/register/register_volume39_issue50.pdf). They can also be found on our website at <http://www.illinois.gov/iema/laws/Pages/regs-title32.aspx>.

The final amendments address decommissioning requirements and include an increase in the amount of information the licensee must provide in their financial surety cost estimate, add circumstances for when a cost estimate needs to be reviewed and revised, update an old reference for public information requests, amend the number of copies of a license application needed and add surveys for radioactive contamination of subsurface areas that are potentially contaminated as a result of facility operations.
