*** This list is compiled based on a recent Office of the General Counsel review of energy and utility mutual fund reports and prospectuses which show that at least 25% of the assets of each fund are entities in the first four categories of this list. Because the holdings of a fund change, employees should contact OGC if a fund listed above holds less than 25% of its assets in prohibited securities. In addition to these NRC-specific limitations, the government-wide restrictions remain on participation in a particular matter by an employee owning more than \$15,000 of any sector fund where the participation could directly and predictably affect the financial interests of any entity in that particular sector fund. Where the matter is a generic one (such as rulemakings) employees can participate if they do not own more than \$50,000 in the affected sector mutual fund.
