RIN 3150-AI98	NRC-2011-0089	04/18/2011	Institute of Electrical and Electronic (IEEE) Standard 603-2009	This rule would amend the Commission's regulations to incorporate by reference the IEEE 603-2009 Standard Criteria for Safety Systems for Nuclear Power Generating Stations into Title 10 of the <i>Code of Federal Regulations</i> (10 CFR) 50.55a. The NRC has a well-established practice of approving and/or mandating the use of IEEE standards in 10 CFR 50.55a through the rulemaking process of incorporation by reference. This practice assures consistency across the industry and that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) will continue to support the use of the most updated and technically sound techniques developed by the IEEE to provide adequate protection to the public. This rulemaking also enhances the efficiency and effectiveness of NRC regulations by making use of current voluntary consensus standards and is consistent with applicable requirements of the National Technology Transfer and Advancement Act. RIN 3150-AJ66	NRC-2015-0233	09/16/2015	Revision of Fee Schedules: Fee Recovery for FY 2016	<p>This rule would implement the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990, as amended, which requires the NRC to recover approximately 90 percent of its budget authority in a given fiscal year, less the amounts appropriated from the Waste Incidental to Reprocessing and generic homeland security activities, through fees assessed to licensees. This rulemaking would amend the Commission's fee schedules for licensing, inspection, and annual fees charged to its applicants and licensees. The licensing and inspection fees are established under 10 CFR Part 170 and recover the NRC's cost of providing services to identifiable applicants and licensees. Examples of services provided by the NRC for which 10 CFR Part 170 fees are assessed include license application reviews, license renewals, license amendment reviews, and inspections. The annual fees established under 10 CFR Part 171 recover budgeted costs for generic (e.g., research and rulemaking) and other regulatory activities not recovered under 10 CFR Part 170 fees.</p>	Before the Commission.
