Duke Power Company is filing herewith Amendment No. 12 to its Application for Licenses for the Oconee Nuclear Station, which is under construction pursuant to provisional construction permits CPPR-33, -34, and -35 issued by the Commission on November 6, 1967. This filing includes three (3) signed original copies of the Amendment with attachments, and seventy (70) copies of Revision No. 5 to the Oconee Final Safety Analysis Report, which was filed as Amendment No. 7 on June 2, 1969.

This Amendment also incorporates by reference, as part of our license application, Babcock & Wilcox Topical Reports BAW-10010, Part 3, "Stability Margin for Xenon Oscillations - Two-and Three-Dimensional Digital Analysis," dated April, 1970 and BAW-10021, "TEMP-Thermal Enthalpy Mixing Program," dated April, 1970, which have been submitted to you by Babcock & Wilcox.

The Amendment is in a format designed to keep current the application and the Final Safety Analysis Report. Please add the supplementary material and insert the revised pages as replacements for existing pages in the seventy-three (73) copies of the Final Safety Analysis Report (Serial Nos. 1-73), as per the attached tabulation identified as FSAR Revision No. 5.

FSAR Supplement 2 (Part of FSAR Revision No. 5) responds to the questions attached to Dr. Peter A. Morris's letter of February 13, 1970 which were marked "Later" in FSAR Supplement 1, dated April 20, 1970; answers questions 11.8, 14.3.1, and 14.3.2 of the list attached to The Director's letter of March 3, 1970; and also identifies additional information voluntarily submitted. Where feasible, the information has been incorporated into the appropriate sections of the FSAR. The Supplement tabulates the questions in the same format as the Director's letters, giving the information or the reference where it is contained in the FSAR.
