Certification of Financial Assurance for Decommissioning - Statement of Intent

In accordance with 10 CFR 72.30(e)(4), this document constitutes the Eugene Water & Electric Board's (EWEB's) Statement of Intent, as a government agency fulfilling the decommissioning funding obligations of a licensee, to have adequate funds available when necessary for radiological decommissioning activities associated with the following facility:

Trojan Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation (ISFSI)
NRC Material License No. SNM-2509
Docket Number: 72-017
71760 Columbia River Hwy
Rainier, Oregon 97048

The Trojan ISFSI is jointly owned by Portland General Electric Company (PGE), 67.5 percent; EWEB, 30 percent; and Pacific Power & Light/PacifiCorp, 2.5 percent. PGE is the majority owner and has responsibility for operating and maintaining the Trojan ISFSI.


A site-specific estimate of the costs associated with radiological decommissioning of the Trojan ISFSI is maintained in the Trojan ISFSI Preliminary Radiological Decommissioning Plan. The total radiological decommissioning costs are estimated to be in the amount of \$5,917,000 in nominal dollars, of which EWEB is obligated to pay its 30 percent ownership share in the amount of \$1,775,000.

As General Manager of EWEB, I exercise express authority and responsibility to request from the Board of Directors of EWEB funds for decommissioning activities associated with operations authorized by U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Material License No. SNM-2509. This authority is established by Chapter 225 of the Oregon Revised Statutes and the EWEB Bylaws. I also exercise express authority and responsibility to request payment of such funds associated with EWEB's 30 percent ownership share of the Trojan ISFSI from the Bonneville Power Administration (Bonneville) pursuant to Net Billing Agreements between EWEB and Bonneville. Bonneville's confirmation of its contractual obligation to provide such funds is attached to this Statement of Intent.

Within this authority, I intend to request that funds be made available when necessary in the amount of \$1,775,000, representing EWEB's 30 percent ownership share of the total radiological decommissioning costs of the Trojan ISFSI. I intend to request and obtain these funds sufficiently in advance of decommissioning to prevent delay of required activities.

As General Manager for EWEB, I do hereby certify that I have the authority to sign this Statement of Intent.

Dear Sir or Madam:

The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) entered into a contract in 1970 with the Eugene Water and Electric Board (EWEB) regarding EWEB's thirty percent ownership share of the Trojan Nuclear Power Plant (Trojan). Under this agreement, BPA provides the funding for EWEB's share of Trojan costs and in turn received EWEB's share of Trojan's power. This agreement remains in place until its termination at the end of all decommissioning activities. Under this agreement, BPA has a contractual commitment to pay any decommissioning costs attributable to EWEB for both the Trojan Nuclear Plant and the Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation. The/Trojan costs are included in BPA's costs which are required by law to be recovered by BPA from its ratepayers. The funding is through the BPA Fund.
