Dear Mr. Hosfeld:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 81 to your NRC Material License No. 21-01549-02 in accordance with your request.

Please note that significant changes to your license may appear in **bold** font, including the change in the name on your license.

By letter dated October 30, 2015, MidMichigan Medical Center submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) a Request for Consent to Direct License Transfer of NRC Materials License No. 21-01549-02. Based on the information you provided, we understand that as a result of the execution of an affiliation agreement between MidMichigan Medical Center and Michigan Health Corporation, a subsidiary of the University of Michigan Health System (MHC), control of "MidMichigan Health," as it is now known, was directly and partially "transferred" in that it was shared with MHC through the affiliation agreement. We further understand that this transfer has not resulted in any change to the licensed materials, persons using the licensed material, location of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program. The licensee's name has now changed from "MidMichigan Medical Center" to "MidMichigan Health."

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report, which documents the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the transfer.
