

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

Dear Dr. Morris,



- 1. By Sections A., C. and D. for Oconee Units 1, 2 and 3 to support issuance of full term operating licenses.
- 2. By Section D. 3. to support the issuance of an operating license authorizing the loading of fuel and limited operation within the scope of Section 50.57(c), 10 CFR 50, for Unit 1, pending completion of NEPA review, if such authorization is necessary.
- 3. By Section E. to show cause why the construction permits for Units 2 and 3 should not be suspended, in whole or in part, pending completion of NEPA review.

Also enclosed is the Applicant's "Request for the Issuance of an Operating License Authorizing Limited Power Operations" on Oconee Unit 1, in the event the NEPA review has not been completed in time for the issuance of a full term operating license, making such special authorization necessary.
