We understand the U.S. Army Installation Management Command has submitted a license amendment application to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission to possess depleted uranium from Davy Crockett M101 spotting rounds at various Army installations, including the Donnelly Training Area, at Fort Wainwright, Alaska.

No ESA-listed species or designated critical habitat occur in the area of Fort Wainwright; therefore, the proposed amendment application would have no effect on listed species or critical habitat. Preparation of a Biological Assessment or further consultation under section 7 of the Endangered Species Act regarding this project location is not necessary. This determination applies only to endangered and threatened species under our jurisdiction.
