Hi Nancy,

We do not make our real time data available to the public. We do share the data with select government agencies through RadResponder. We stream two feeds from our radiation data base that collects the CREST data, one is hourly averages from the monitoring stations and the other is live minute by minute data. We evaluate access based who gets access to the real time data feed in RadResponder based on need. Obviously we provide that to select folks at DOE and EPA that perform radiological assessment at CMHT and the Advisory Team. We also provide real time data to contiguous states. Frieda's group in Delaware has access to our real time data. NRC has never asked us for it so they do not have access.

Have Steve give me a call if he needs more information. I am sure that he spoke with Kay Foster in Illinois.

NJEPA maintains environs monitoring equipment at Oyster Creek and At artificial Island. Three are 16 fixed monitoring stations at each site from which readings are telemetered back to the State for use by State personnel at the State EOC. Their web site describes the system and what it does with the data. The web site description is silent with regard to the collected data being available to the public. There is no such link on their public website. I suspect they don't.

My query is associated with the NTTF recommendation 11.3, that the NRC consider the usefulness of requiring licensees to install such systems.

I think that making it publically available on a real time basis will create problems during the implementation of protective actions for a real event. I had a conversation with the person who leads the Illinois capability that monitors 11 plants, and she made it very clear that none of that data is made publically available on a real-time basis, but is available to the qualified personnel in the State radiological assessment center to assist with decision-making.

Do you know whether or not New Jersey makes these data available on a real-time basis? If not, can you suggest a POC that could answer the question?
