Dear Mr. Goorevich:

Enclosed is an application, dated January 19, 2016, received by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) from Honeywell International, Inc., requesting amendment No. 01 to its existing license, XSOU8826. The license presently authorizes the export of 5,000,000 kilograms of natural uranium concentrates ( $U_3O_8$ ) and uranium tetrafluoride ( $UF_4$ ) to Canada to be used as process material at the Port Hope Conversion Facility and Cameco Corporation Fuel Services.

The purpose of this amendment is to: 1) include an additional intermediate foreign consignee; and 2) extend the date of expiration from May 31, 2016 to December 31, 2026.

There are no changes to the terms and conditions of the existing license being requested; therefore, our office is processing this as a minor amendment. The NRC intends to issue the license after the required 30-day review period.
