Dear Sara Forster,

Attached is the sign letter for the full transfer of control from Indian Creek Vet. Hospital to Indian Creek Therapeutics.

To answer your question,

We went through a very long and details process for approval by Colleen Carol Casey for the original NRC license to be approved. I consulted with MPC since they assisted in the process of obtaining our license.

Since this license isn't PART 35, we do not have an exemption to use sealed sources. Therefore we have to specifically list any sources we might use. Colleen Casey requested we be very specific on our license.

Cobalt-57 Seal Source (8f) with a max amount to be 15 mCi.

We could use Cobalt-57 for equipment calibration and QC. We currently have been using Cs-137 and Ba-133 sources.

Let me know if this helps answers your question. I can talk with you over the phone if you need more information or have a follow up question.
