REGULATORY COMMISSION REGULATORY INFORMATION SUMMARY
2014-07, JUNE 19, 2014 (PROJ0769)

Dear Mr. Bergman:

In a letter, "NuScale Power Response to Regulatory Information Summary (RIS) 2014-07 (NRC Project No. 0769)," LO-0514-7173, dated June 19, 2014 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML14170B233), Mr. Steven Mirsky, Manager, Licensing, at NuScale Power, LLC (NuScale), requested that the proprietary Enclosure 1, "NuScale Power Response to NRC RIS 2014-07," to the letter be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390:

- "NuScale Power Response to NRC RIS 2014-07," Enclosure 1, (ADAMS Accession No. ML14170B232).

A nonproprietary copy of the Enclosure 1, identified as Enclosure 2, has been placed in the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Public Document Room and added to ADAMS at the indicated accession number:

- "NuScale Power Response to NRC RIS 2014-07," Enclosure 2, (ADAMS Accession No. ML14170B231).

The above enclosures were provided to the NRC staff in response to the NRC RIS 2014-07, "Enhancements to the Vendor Inspection Program-Vendor Information Request," dated May 5, 2014 (ADAMS Accession No. ML13168A215)

In the June 19, 2014, letter the NuScale affidavit (ADAMS Accession No. ML14170B230) stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure due to the proprietary nature of the information presented.

The NRC staff reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390 and, on the basis of the statements in the affidavit, have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure.

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Therefore, the version of the submitted information marked as proprietary will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the slides. If the need arises, we may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. We will, of course, ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future, such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC staff. You also should understand that the NRC staff may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all review situations, if the NRC staff makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
