Good morning,

I have just read a short "mLive" news report, ("Palisades nuclear plant wasn't straight with NRC on leak, report says") that some Entergy/Palisades people were not honest with the NRC. A link to an NRC document was provided, which I read. Could you take a look at it?

First off, see that it refers to an investigation completed March 10, 2015. Then look at the date of the letter. It appears that the letter was sent before the investigation was done, doesn't it since the letter is dated February 22, 2015? How can that be?

Next notice that action needed to be taken in either 30 or 45 days after receipt of the letter. I estimated this to be about April 1, 2015 or April 15, 2015. It is now 2016 and I did not see any listing of enforcement action for Palisades on the NRC website. Considering that the leak existed by at least 2011, do you consider this time delay appropriate?

Then, at the bottom, although it appears to me that the letter was scanned (since I see color), notice that nobody signed the letter by hand.

Finally, notice that the responsible person, "Patrick L. Loudon, Director", had somebody else issue the letter.

Is this the way the NRC operates today?

Shouldn't some AIM2016 action be taken on all the time spent without any enforcement results?
