To Whom It May Concern:

The purpose of this letter is to request your assistance in effecting an amendment to Hitachi America, Ltd. ("Hitachi") license number 04-23985-01E (for possession of Krypton-85, incident to exempt distribution; copy of Hitachi's license, as previously amended, is enclosed herewith) in connection with the recently completed relocation, to a different Southern California warehouse, of the goods covered by its license.

1. Removal of Former Warehouse Location from License No. 04-23985-01E

Your office recently issued an amendment of Hitachi's existing license that added the following address as an approved warehouse location under Item 11 of the license:

8369 Milliken Avenue
Rancho Cucamonga, California

Effective as of March 3, 2016, Hitachi completed the relocation of its Kr-85 inventory (i.e., Kr-85-containing projectors and Kr-85-containing replacement lamps) to the above 8369 Milliken Avenue, Rancho Cucamonga, California address.


