SUBJECT: WITHHOLDING PROPRIETARY INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC  
DISCLOSURE - SUBMITTAL OF NUSCALE PROPRIETARY AND NON-  
PROPRIETARY DRAFT SLIDES FOR PRE-APPLICATION REVIEW MEETING  
ON SEPTEMBER 2, 2009 (PROJECT NO. 0769)

Dear Mr. Bergman:

In an August 12, 2009, letter (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML092810332), Mr. Thomas Marcille, Chief Operating Officer, NuScale Power LLC, requested that the material discussed during the September 2, 2009, meeting with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390.

In the letter dated August 12, 2009, the affidavit (ADAMS Accession No. ML092810332) stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure due to the proprietary nature of the information presented and discussed.

The NRC staff reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390 and, on the basis of the statements in the affidavit, determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure. Therefore, the version of the submitted information marked as proprietary will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, the NRC staff may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. The NRC staff will, of course, ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC staff. You also should understand that the NRC staff may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all review situations, if the NRC staff makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
