Dr. James Edlin was performing I-131 ablation doses without being on our license as a CFR 35.300 authorized user. He is listed as a 35.100 and 200 authorized user. I was aware that he was qualified as a 35.300 user on other radioactive materials licenses, but failed to realize that on my license he was not authorized as a 35.300 authorized user.

As a result Dr. Edlin has not been supervising I-131 administration since this was discovered during inspection. I have submitted a request for amendment to my license to correct this error.

In the future the review of all authorized users has been added to the agenda of our yearly internal review meeting.

We were immediately in compliance as soon as the error was discovered, in that Dr. Edlin will not supervise any I-131 administrations until the completed amended license is received and reviewed.
