


PROGRAM SCOPE

This was an announced routine inspection of the US Army Joint Munitions Command operations at Anniston Army Depot. The licensee is authorized to possess, receive, store, and transfer military devices containing depleted uranium in ammunition and components at the facility.

PERFORMANCE OBSERVATIONS

The inspector conducted interviews with licensee staff and identified that adequate knowledge was possessed to ensure safe storage and transfer of licensed material. The inspector observed two storage locations on-site and verified the inventories and postings for those locations. The inspector conducted independent and confirmatory surveys at the storage locations using a Ludlum Model 2401-P survey instrument (SN 142673; Cal Due 10/07/2016). Surveys resulted in dose rates up to 1.4 millirem per hour in the storage areas and 0.02 millirem per hour (background) in unrestricted areas and were comparable to the licensee's results. The inspector reviewed documentation associated with inventories, audits, internal survey reports, training documents and dosimetry records; no issues were noted.

No violations of NRC regulatory requirements were identified during this inspection.
