SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 03035424/2016002, DISTRICT HOSPITAL PARTNERS, L.P., D/B/A THE GEORGE WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL, WASHINGTON, D.C. AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Ms. Russo:

On February 16 and 17, 2016, Robin Elliott and Shawn Seeley of this office conducted a safety and security inspection at the above address of activities authorized by the above listed NRC license. The inspection continued in-office through March 16, 2016. The inspection was an examination of your licensed activities as they relate to the safety and security of radioactive material and to compliance with the Commission's regulations and the license conditions. The inspection consisted of observations by the inspectors, interviews with personnel, and a selective examination of representative records. The findings of the inspection were discussed with Mark Lerner, Division Director; Arnold Able, Radiation Safety Officer; and other members of your organization at the conclusion of the inspection on a teleconference on March 16, 2016.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined one or more violations of NRC requirements occurred. Because of the security-related nature of any such violations, the number and characterization will not be provided in this letter, but instead are provided in non-public enclosures. The violation(s) were evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The violation(s) is/are cited in the Notice of Violation (Notice), provided as Enclosure 1 to this letter. The violation(s) is/are cited because the violation(s) was/were identified by NRC. Enclosure 2 provides a description of the corrective actions committed to by District Hospital Partners, L.P. to address any violations.

The NRC has concluded that information regarding the reason for the violation(s), the corrective actions taken and planned to correct the violation and prevent recurrence is already adequately addressed in our records. Therefore, you are not required to respond to this letter unless the description of your corrective actions in Enclosure 2 does not accurately reflect your corrective
