OCONEE EXAM CONCERNS

Examination Report 97-300

Examiner Concerns

- Examination Quality
- NRC/Licensee Interface

- Written exam did not meet examiner standards
 - SRO questions not at proper cognitive level and contained implausible distractors
 - ▶ RO level questions low level memory or "single topic" questions

- Possible contributors to an inadequate written examination
 - ▶ Use of 5 current operators to take exam
 - Ops team member's lack of experience with examination techniques

- ► Simulator scenarios did not fully exercise the EOPs as required
 - Scenarios ended with a reactor trip
 - Malfunctions occurred after the reactor trip not before as required for testable responses

- Walk-through examination did not comply with examiner standards
 - Contrary to examiner standards JPM sets had repeat safety functions
 - Follow-up questions were written based on a "Closed book" v. "Open book"

► INTERFACE PROBLEMS

- Reluctance to change questions to meet standards
- Corporate suggestions not fully considered

NRC/LICENSEE INTERFACE

▶ Extension of exam time beyond standards without NRC consultation
