Gentlemen:

The purpose of this letter is to provide a status update on implementation of the commitments made in my response to Generic Letter 90-03, submitted on September 14, 1990 for all three Duke Power's nuclear stations. Within my September 14, 1990 response, I stated that Duke will identify and inform by letters our NSSS vendors to establish points of contact for communicating technical information concerning safety-safety equipment. This action was to be completed by January 1, 1991.

Duke has identified those vendors supplying safety-related components as outlined in the Generic Letter 90-03, dated March 20, 1990 and its supplement dated May 4, 1990. Letters were written on November 26, 1990 requesting each vendor to 1) supply technical information to the Operating Experience Program Staff as their primary single point of contact for all future notification of technical information at Duke Power Company for safety-related equipment, 2) express that periodic contact would be established to obtain technical information that may not have been received and 3) request a response as to their position in support of Duke's efforts to adhere to the provisions as outlined in the Generic Letter.

The Operating Experience Program Staff along with the Quality Assurance, Vendor Support Staff are working to establish a more appropriate point of contact for those vendors who have not responded to our request. We are in the process of contacting these vendors via letter to reiterate Duke's full compliance with respect to the Generic Letter and solicit their position in support of Duke's efforts. These vendors will be advised that failure to provide support of all provisions of Generic Letter 90-03 could potentially affect future purchasing agreements. For those vendors who demonstrate a lack of support, the maintenance

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group will review periodic maintenance data to assure reliability and determine the need for any changes to compensate. In addition, the Quality Assurance Department will modify surveillance activities as another means to compensate for inadequate vendor support.
