Your letter dated May 30, 1989, expressed concern about the manner in which certain regulatory concerns have been resolved recently at Duke Power nuclear stations.

As I understand the issues, staff positions were established not only with Duke Power Company but with other utilities quite some time ago, and prolonged technical discussions have continued for a substantial length of time. When these discussions have exhausted all points of view and are no longer beneficial, as is the case for certain TMI Action Plan Items related to your facilities, a regulatory decision must be made.

The number of operating plants and limited staff resources preclude protracted discussions on safety issues that are determined to be necessary. Once a licensee's differing position on a regulatory requirement is understood, a regulatory decision will be made as to the acceptability of that differing position. If an order implementing the regulatory requirement is being considered, it is with the knowledge and concurrence of NRR management.

I would be pleased to meet with you to discuss this issue, as well as any perceived communication difficulties, if you believe that such a meeting is needed. In those cases in which Duke Power believes that issues are not being properly resolved, I endorse your proposal of escalation through normal NRR management channels. Appeals above the Division Director may be made to Mr. James G. Partlow, the NRR Associate Director for Projects.
