**SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 03038699/2016002, DOMINION NDT SERVICES, INC., CHESTER, VIRGINIA, SITE AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION**

Dear Mr. Vargo:

On March 24, 2016, Randolph Ragland of this office conducted a security inspection at 2204 Commerce Road, Richmond, Virginia, of activities authorized by the above listed NRC license. The inspection continued in-office until May 5, 2016. The inspection was limited to a review of your implementation of 10 CFR 37 requirements in areas under NRC jurisdiction. The inspection consisted of observations by the inspector, interviews with personnel, and selective examination of representative records. Additional information provided in an April 27, 2016, telephone conversation between you and Randolph Ragland of this office was also examined as part of the inspection. The findings of the inspection were discussed with you and Mr. Norman Boggs, of your organization, at the conclusion of the inspection on May 5, 2016.

Based on the results of this inspection and in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, the NRC has determined that three Severity Level IV violations of NRC requirements occurred. The current Enforcement Policy is included on NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The violations are cited because they were identified by the NRC. Enclosure 2 provides a determination of severity level and a description of the corrective and preventative actions taken by Dominion NDT Services, Inc., to address the violations.

The NRC has concluded that information regarding the reason for the violations, the corrective actions taken and planned to correct the violations and prevent recurrence is already adequately addressed in our records. Therefore, you are not required to respond to this letter unless the description of your corrective actions in this letter does not accurately reflect your corrective actions or your position. In that case, or if you choose to provide additional information, you should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice.
