SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF A PUBLIC MEETING WITH SOUTHERN NUCLEAR  
OPERATING COMPANY AND SOUTH CAROLINA ELECTRIC & GAS  
ON JUNE 9, 2016

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff held a Category 2 public meeting with Southern Nuclear Operating Company (SNC) and South Carolina Electric & Gas (SCE&G) on June 9, 2016. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss issues associated with the safety review of licensing actions for SNC's Vogtle Electric Generating Plant (VEGP) Units 3 and 4, and SCE&G's Virgil C. Summer Nuclear Station (VCSNS) Units 2 and 3.

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Summary of Meeting:

On June 9, 2016, staff from the NRC conducted a public meeting with representatives from SNC and SCE&G to discuss issues associated with the safety review of licensing actions for SNC's VEGP Units 3 and 4, and SCE&G's VCSNS Units 2 and 3. Specifically, the meeting discussed (1) preservice and in-service inspection (PSI/ISI) design for inspectability limitations and (2) SNC's draft request for alternative PSI for SG nozzle to RCP casing welds.

The first topic discussed was the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) Section XI PSI/ISI inspection limitations for AP1000 valves and fitting welds. The licensees, through their vendor, Westinghouse Electric Company (WEC), walked through the presentation slides, explaining the ASME Section XI PSI/ISI requirements and the issues they have encountered with the design and accessibility requirements for ASME Code Class 1, 2, and 3 components. WEC described that the problem relates to three categories of welds with examination coverage concerns, where the designs meet the requirements of ASME Section III but cannot be inspected as required by ASME Section XI. The staff noted that it was the NRC's and industry's expectation that new builds would have the ability to do a better job with design for inspectability and was surprised that there were these examination coverage concerns. WEC described the proposed resolution, explaining that the proposed alternative will have a similar technical basis to ASME Code Cases N-481 and N-770, that the materials are reliable and not susceptible to age-related degradation mechanisms beyond fatigue. The NRC technical staff emphasized that industry representatives should consider how any proposed alternative could improve upon the inspections being conducted for similarly limited locations in operating plants. The licensees stated that they plan to submit a proposed alternative, following the guidance of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) 50.55a, for NRC staff's review.

The second topic discussed was SNC's draft request for alternative PSI requirements for the SG nozzle to RCP casing welds. SNC walked through their proposal to use the 2013 Edition of ASME Section XI for the inspection requirements of these welds as amended by the six NRC conditions specified in *Federal Register* Volume 81, No. 41, March 2, 2016, "Proposed Rules, to conditionally accept ASME Code Case N-799." SNC explained the six conditions and SNC's application of each, described in the draft proposed alternative request. Related to SNC's application of Condition 3, the staff asked why SNC is proposing to take an exception to performing a volumetric examination of the entire weld volume given that their draft submittal states that the examination procedure is qualified for the full thickness of the weld. During the discussion, SNC stated that radiographic testing and ultrasonic testing (UT) of the full weld volume was completed in the shop to satisfy ASME Section III requirements, but the UT is not credited for preservice inspection because it was not qualified in accordance with ASME Section XI, Appendix VIII. The staff noted that a description of the volumetric examinations performed on the welds would provide additional clarification in this proposed alternative request. SNC stated that they would consider the staff's feedback and revise their request, if appropriate, before formally submitting.

At the end of each topic discussed, there was an opportunity for the public to provide comments and ask questions. All comments and questions were addressed before moving to the next topic or ending the meeting.
