Hi Jill,

I called your number but it wouldn't let me leave a voice mail. When would you be available to talk about this report? There are several issues/questions which I would like to talk with your about. Here are a few of the most important;

- Are you also consulting on the Class III Survey by the Greers? We have yet to review that report but you do not ask for concurrence with it in your letter.
- Site forms and Isolates. In the format submitted these are unusable. Each Isolate or Site form should be individually stapled together. As they are now they are all stapled together, with the front page of one form on the back side of the last page of the form before it. These need to be collated properly.
- Tribal site recordation. Unless these sites are given Smithsonian numbers and properly recorded on Wyoming Forms our office cannot consider them as part of the Section 106 process. I recommend that you refer to the "Wyoming State Historic Preservation Office Format, Guidelines, and Standards for Class II and III Reports" Stipulation XIV (<http://wyoshpo.state.wy.us/pdf/ClassIIIReportStandards.pdf>). These standards were developed in consultation with the professional archaeological community as well as all the federal agencies which work in Wyoming. They were also sent out for public comment. Following the Guidelines and Standards is required for every Section 106 survey within the State of Wyoming.
- I am also concerned that the report is still marked as a "Draft" report. Is this the case or is it in fact the final report?
