Mr. Dentel

During the meeting on June 8, 2016 you clearly stated to me that an analysis of the existing pipelines at Indian Point has been performed. While this may be an accurate statement, the NRC continues to refused to provide me with a copy of this analysis. I have now filed a FOIA request for a copy of the analysis (see enclosed) for the buried portion of the two pipelines located within 400 feet of the control room and other vital structures.

You referenced (ML15287A257) and other unidentified communication as being responsive to this analysis.

I and enclosing pages from ML15287A257 and this information appears to contradict your public statement. I have requested a copy of this specific analysis only to be provided with evasive responses.

The information you provided to the public is in direct conflict with the information provided to me by your predecessor, Mr Art Burritt.

Both answers are in conflict with one another. Please identify which is the accurate information.

I will agree with one point in your email and that is "The NRC have had extensive correspondence with you on the existing gas pipelines and the proposed gas pipeline that traverse the Indian Point owner-controlled area." but never a direct response or valid analysis.

A copy of this is being sent to the Office of the Inspector General as there is an active ongoing investigation.
