Dear Dr. Stephens:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 52 amending your NRC Material License No. 13-13028-02 in accordance with your request. Please note that the license was generated using the Web Based Licensing System (WBL) and is in landscape format rather than portrait format.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please note that we have removed License Condition 13 regarding the transportation of licensed materials because this requirement is in the regulations 10 CFR Part 71. Also note, as discussed with Natilee Jones by telephone on July 5, 2016, and Patrick Byrne by telephone on July 6, 2016, the wording for performing sentinel lymph node procedures at the new location of use is in License Condition 10.B.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
