Subject: Disposal of waste from the US Virgin Islands in Texas

Mr. McCormick,

I understand that you have inquired about approvals required to transfer low-level radioactive waste from the United States Virgin Islands to the State of Texas for disposal.

The decision to accept any radioactive waste for disposal in Texas is a matter that only the State of Texas and the Texas Compact can decide. NRC has no jurisdiction in this matter. I can say that waste generated in the United States Virgin Islands is, under the Atomic Energy Act, US generated waste and for this reason, no import license is required to transfer the radioactive waste between the US Virgin Islands and the State of Texas.
