On behalf of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), I am responding to your letters dated July 2, 2016, in which you appealed the agency's June 22, 2016, decision related to FOIA/PA-2016-0507 and June 24, 2016, decision related to FOIA/PA-2016-0506, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests. In your July 2, 2016, letters you're appealing the adequacy of the search conducted by the NRC for internal and external correspondence related to CON-2011-0003 and CON-2011-0004.

Acting on your appeal, we have conducted a thorough search for these records and no records were located. Therefore, I conclude that the search performed was adequate and your appeal is denied.

This is the final agency decision. As set forth in the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(a)(4)(8)), you may seek judicial review of this decision in the district court of the United States in the district in which you reside or have your principal place of business. You may also seek judicial review in the district in which the agency's records are situated or in the District of Columbia.

The 2007 FOIA amendments created the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) to offer mediation services to resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a nonexclusive alternative to litigation.
