B.2 CONSIDERATION AND OBLIGATION-TASK ORDERS (AUG 2011)

- (a) The ceiling of this order for is \$11,906.28.
- (b) This order is subject to the minimum and maximum ordering requirements set forth in the contract.
- (c) The amount presently obligated with respect to this order is \$11,906.28. The obligated amount shall, at no time, exceed the order ceiling as specified in paragraph (a) above. When and if the amount(s) paid and payable to the Contractor hereunder shall equal the obligated amount, the Contractor shall not be obligated to continue performance of the work unless and until the Contracting Officer shall increase the amount obligated with respect to this order, in accordance with FAR Part 43 - Modifications. Any work undertaken by the Contractor in excess of the obligated amount specified above is done so at the Contractor's sole risk and may not be reimbursed by the Government.
- (d) The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of FAR 52.232-22 - Limitation of Funds, for incrementally-funded delivery orders or task orders.

SECTION C - DESCRIPTION/SPECIFICATIONS/STATEMENT OF WORK

1 PROJECT TITLE

Operations Center Information Management System (OCIMS) Operations and Maintenance – Anti-vibration solution to resolve Projector Movement and Alignment due to subway train shaking building.

2 BACKGROUND

The Operations Center Information Management System (OCIMS) is a General Support System (GSS) that is a collection of Information Technology and Information Management (IT/IM) systems. The current projector mounting in the HOC are unable to withstand the

constant vibration from trains passing beneath the building. The shaking impacts projector alignment and focus. The projectors are currently mounted to the soffit overhead.

3 SCOPE

The contractor shall install an Anti-vibration solution to resolve Projector Movement and Alignment for the 6 projectors located in the RST/PMT (B1C18) area of the operations center. This solution must diminish the movement of the projectors caused by trains and should reduce the need for repeated alignments and adjustments. Care will be taken to present a solution that requires minimal or no drywall modifications.

4 APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS

The "As Is" layout for the projectors will be provided upon request.

5 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor shall perform the following tasks in accordance with technical direction from the COR or their authorized representative and following the guidance provided in NRC Management Directive 2.8 (MD 2.8), as applicable.

5.1. Task 1: Project Management (Firm Fixed Price)

The contractor shall provide a Program Manager to oversee the installation.

5.2. Task 2: Install anti-vibration solution (Firm Fixed Price)

- Install anti-vibration mounts to the 6 projectors located in the RST/PMT (B1C18) area.
- This install must be coordinated with the COR to ensure that this installation does not impact an event or exercise.
- The install will take a phased approach to ensure that the center has partial use of the display wall in case of an emergency.
- Ensure all projectors are securely mounted with access to serviceable parts.
- Ensure images have been aligned properly.
- Ensure vibration is minimized to reduce repeated alignments between bulb changes.
- The work area shall be cleaned and serviceable at the end of each day's work.

6. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

The Contractor shall perform work under this task order in such a manner to ensure that the vibration issue is mitigated to the greatest extent.

7. METHOD OF SURVEILLANCE

Performance standards shall be measured by a combination of random sampling and customer input.

8. INCENTIVES

Failure to provide a timely and acceptable solution will be subject to the following deductions:

3% reduction to amount payable for the firm-fixed-price portion of the contract

9. DELIVERABLES AND DELIVERY SCHEDULE

The install of the solution shall be performed during the period of performance (08/01/2016 – 07/31/2017).

An updated "As-Is" document and any manuals for the installed equipment will be provided to the COR.

10. GOVERNMENT-FURNISHED PROPERTY

The anti-vibration hardware will be installed on the 6 Panasonic PT-DZ6710 projectors located in the RST/PMT area (B1C18) of the Operations Center.

11. SECURITY

The work provided under this Task Order is UNCLASSIFIED.

SECTION D - PACKAGING AND MARKING

D.1 Branding, Packaging and Marking for this task order shall be in accordance with Section D of the base contract NRC-HQ-11-16-E-0001.

SECTION E - INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

E.1 Inspection and acceptance of the deliverable items to be furnished hereunder shall be made by the NRC Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) at the destination.

(b) Performance of the work under this contract is subject to the technical direction of the NRC project officer. The term technical direction is defined to include the following:

(1) Technical direction to the contractor which shifts work emphasis between areas of work or tasks, authorizes travel which was unanticipated in the Schedule (i.e., travel not contemplated in the Statement of Work or changes to specific travel identified in the Statement of Work), fills in details, or otherwise serves to accomplish the contractual statement of work.

(2) Provide advice and guidance to the contractor in the preparation of drawings, specifications, or technical portions of the work description.

(3) Review and, where required by the contract, approve technical reports, drawings, specifications, and technical information to be delivered by the contractor to the Government under the contract.

(c) Technical direction must be within the general statement of work stated in the contract. The project officer does not have the authority to and may not issue any technical direction which:

(1) Constitutes an assignment of work outside the general scope of the contract.

(2) Constitutes a change as defined in the "Changes" clause of this contract.

(3) In any way causes an increase or decrease in the total estimated contract cost, the fixed fee, if any, or the time required for contract performance.

- (4) Changes any of the expressed terms, conditions, or specifications of the contract.
 - (5) Terminates the contract, settles any claim or dispute arising under the contract, or issues any unilateral directive whatever.
- (d) All technical directions must be issued in writing by the project officer or must be confirmed by the project officer in writing within ten (10) working days after verbal issuance. A copy of the written direction must be furnished to the contracting officer. A copy of NRC Form 445, Request for Approval of Official Foreign Travel, which has received final approval from the NRC must be furnished to the contracting officer.
- (e) The contractor shall proceed promptly with the performance of technical directions duly issued by the project officer in the manner prescribed by this clause and within the project officer's authority under the provisions of this clause.
- (f) If, in the opinion of the contractor, any instruction or direction issued by the project officer is within one of the categories defined in paragraph (c) of this section, the contractor may not proceed but shall notify the contracting officer in writing within five (5) working days after the receipt of any instruction or direction and shall request that contracting officer to modify the contract accordingly. Upon receiving the notification from the contractor, the contracting officer shall issue an appropriate contract modification or advise the contractor in writing that, in the contracting officer's opinion, the technical direction is within the scope of this article and does not constitute a change under the "Changes" clause.
- (g) Any unauthorized commitment or direction issued by the project officer may result in an unnecessary delay in the contractor's performance and may even result in the contractor expending funds for unallowable costs under the contract.
- (h) A failure of the parties to agree upon the nature of the instruction or direction or upon the contract action to be taken with respect to the instruction or direction is subject to 52.233-1 - Disputes.
- (i) In addition to providing technical direction as defined in paragraph (b) of the section, the project officer shall:
- (1) Monitor the contractor's technical progress, including surveillance and assessment of performance, and recommend to the contracting officer changes in requirements.
 - (2) Assist the contractor in the resolution of technical problems encountered during performance.

- (3) Review all costs requested for reimbursement by the contractor and submit to the contracting officer recommendations for approval, disapproval, or suspension of payment for supplies and services required under this contract.

G.2 INVOICES

The contractor shall submit a monthly invoice to NRC by the 15th of each month in accordance with the NRC Billing Instructions found in the base contract NRC-HQ-11-16-E-0001.

SECTION H - SPECIAL TASK ORDER REQUIREMENTS

H.1 TASK ORDER PROVISIONS

The provisions in Section H - SPECIAL CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS of the IDIQ Contract NRC-HQ-11-16-E-0001 are applicable to this task order.

H.2 SECURITY

The security requirements under the IDIQ Contract NRC-HQ-11-16-E-0001 shall apply to this task order. The work under this task order is unclassified.

SECTION I- CONTRACT CLAUSES

I.1 The clauses and provisions incorporated in full text or by reference in IDIQ Contract NRC-HQ-11-16-E-0001 are hereby incorporated into this task order.

I.2 FAR 52.217-8 Option to Extend Services

The Government may require continued performance of any services within the limits and at the rates specified in the contract. These rates may be adjusted only as a result of revisions to prevailing labor rates provided by the Secretary of Labor. The option provision may be exercised more than once, but the total extension of performance hereunder shall not exceed 6 months. The Contracting Officer may exercise the option by written notice to the Contractor at anytime before expiration of the task order.
