SUBJECT: RESPONSE TO NRC INSPECTION REPORT 030-38049/2016-001 AND
NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Dr. McCormick:

On July 13, 2016, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) cited Rehabilitation Medicine Associates, PC for a violation involving the failure to document the basis for authorizing the release of individuals after the administration of unsealed byproduct material. Inspection Report 030-38049/2016-001 with enclosed Notice of Violation (ML16188A407) required you to respond in writing in 30 days. You responded by letter dated August 2, 2016 (ML16223A780).

After reviewing the information you provided in your response to the Notice of Violation, we have concluded that your completed and proposed actions appear to adequately address the regulatory noncompliance described in the Notice of Violation. We will review your implementation of these corrective actions during a future inspection to determine whether full compliance has been restored and whether compliance will be maintained.
