Dear Ms. Bladey,

The State of Wisconsin, Radioactive Materials Program has reviewed the above document and submits the following comments:

1. Wisconsin supports the retention of the word "significant" in the heading for Compatibility B Program Elements. This emphasizes that a Compatibility B designation pertains to a small number of program elements, not *any* cross jurisdictional program element.
2. Similarly, Wisconsin recommends using more discretion when designating regulations as "Compatibility B" or "Compatibility C". The NRC should default to "Compatibility C" to offer Agreement States the flexibility to implement more restrictive requirements. "Compatibility B" should be reserved strictly for regulations that present a direct health and safety risk if not implemented exactly as the NRC intended.
