Could you please reply back to confirm receipt?

This is in reference to your letter dated May 24, 2016, requesting to amend Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 06-30624-01 in order document a transfer of ownership of Molecular NeuroImaging to inviCRO LLC. In order to continue our review, we need the following additional information:

1. Please indicate how the name should be reflected on the license (i.e. inviCRO, LLC dba Molecular NeuroImaging). Please also confirm that Molecular NeuroImaging is no longer an independent LLC, but a wholly owned subsidiary of inviCRO, LLC.
2. Please confirm that all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facility will be transferred to the transferee or to the NRC, as appropriate. These records include documentation of surveys of ambient radiation levels and fixed and/or removable contamination, including methods and sensitivity.
3. Please provide a flow chart of organizational structure pre- and post- transaction (these should indicate the license, any parent companies, any grandparent companies, etc.).
4. Since this involves a change in ownership, the letter dated May 24, 2016 should have been cosigned by senior management/ownership of inviCRO, LLC. Please have a senior management representative from inviCRO, LLC confirm in writing that they have reviewed and confirm all commitments made in the May 24, 2016 letter.
5. Please indicate if this is considered to be a direct or indirect change of ownership.
6. In order to determine if inviCRO, LLC is a known entity to the NRC, please confirm if inviCRO, LLC holds any other NRC or Agreement State licenses.
